History

- In 1932 the Archbishop asked Father William Rooney to set up a new parish of Christ the King in Coundon. At first, Mass was celebrated in homes, and in a cinema.
- In January 1933 a temporary wooden church was built.
- In 1938 Christ the King Primary School was opened.
- Christ the King Football Club was founded in 1946.
- The Second Vatican Council was convened by Pope John XX111 in 1959, and in the same year Father McTernan became parish priest. He had the task of introducing the changes to the Liturgy which occurred during the following years, particularly the translation of the Latin Mass into English.
- Cardinal Newman Secondary School was opened for children from parishes on the north side of the City in 1969.
- In 1970 St. Augustine's Primary School was opened and was extended in 1975.
- In 1972 the wooden church was replaced by a brick building.
- In 1973 a new Christ the King Junior School was built in Scots Lane.
- The Community and Social Centre was built in 1975.
- In 1979 St. Augustine's Church was built next to the school, and in 1990 a Sports Centre was opened.
- The visit of Pope John Paul II to Coventry in 1982 coincided with the Golden Jubilee celebrations in the parish.
- In 1993 Father McTernan retired through ill health and Father Eamon Clarke replaced him. The buildings which had been constructed during the 1970s and 1980s were in need of repair. The two churches, the schools, the parish centre and the Presbytery were all renovated, and the Church sanctuary was re-ordered.
- In 1998 two Deacons, Pat Flanagan and Gerry O'Reilly, were ordained for the Parish.
- In 2003 the Sisters of the Holy Rosary established a Convent in the parish.
- Early in 2006 Canon Farrell became parish priest bringing with him much energy and expertise.
- In 2011 Christ the King Infant and Christ the King Junior schools amalgamated to form Christ the King Catholic Primary school, sharing two sites.




