Instructions for my Funeral

Introduction

As Catholic Christians the subject of death, so often a taboo subject in our secular society, is one we should have the confidence to face. This is due to the keystone of our faith—the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead on Easter Day. Each Easter we renew that faith, a faith that tells us that, through our Baptism, we already share that risen life of Jesus, a bond that nothing including death - can ever destroy. That is why we have the confidence to pray the following in the Funeral Mass:

"In him the hope of blessed resurrection has dawned, that those saddened by the certainty of dying might be consoled by the promise of immortality to come. Indeed for your faithful, Lord, life is changed not ended, and when this earthly dwelling turns to dust, an eternal dwelling is made ready for them in heaven."

Even so the prospect of our death can worry us, and it's easy to put off making arrangements such as our Will, or our Funeral, to another day.

Completing this form will make it so much easier for your family or friends to make the arrangements for your Funeral at what will be a sad and difficult time. More importantly, when perhaps your family are not Catholics, or have lapsed from the practice of faith, or where there is no family around to ensure that your wishes are followed. It ensure that you will receive what is your right as a member of the Catholic Church.

For parishioners who may have relatives in care homes please pass this form on, asking them to make the Care provider aware of this form.

If you are admitted to hospital please insist the Hospital Chaplain is informed of your admission and of this form.

When using this form please make a copy. One you can keep among your papers so that those who want to find out your instructions will find it there. A copy can be given to your Parish Priest who will be able to have it at hand when preparations are being made for your Funeral Mass.

Can you also please include a photograph to put on our prayer board in the porch at the time of your Funeral.

As Catholics we believe that the Mass is the best prayer that we can offer as it represents the passion, death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. We recommend therefore that all Catholics have a Requiem Mass at the Church. Experience has shown that next of kin will respect your wishes if these are recorded regardless of whether or not they attend Mass themselves.

If you choose to have a funeral service we would recommend that this takes place in the Church followed by committal, burial, or cremation, as the service will be in a place of worship and it will not be rushed.

The Catholic Church does allow burial or cremation.

Instructions concerning the Readings

With any funeral service there is always a Gospel. If the funeral takes place in the church there must also be a either the Old or New Testament before the Responsorial Psalm or psalm Hymn. You can if you wish have two readings before the Gospel in which case the first one comes from the Old Testament and the second from the non-Gospel writings in the New Testament.
